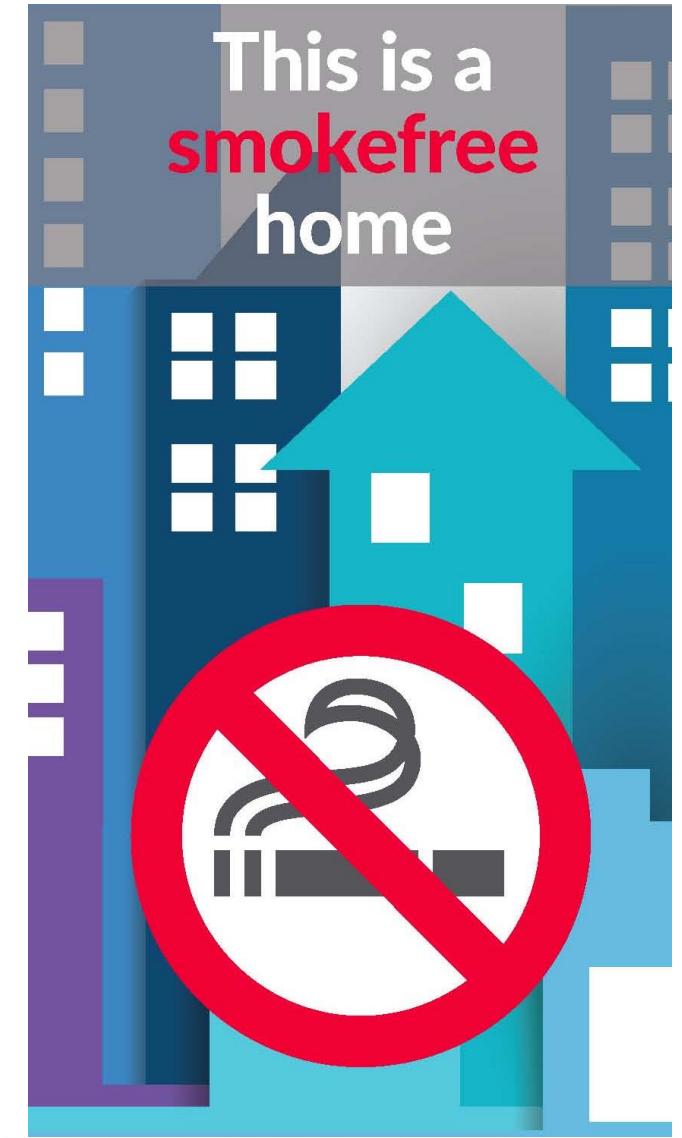

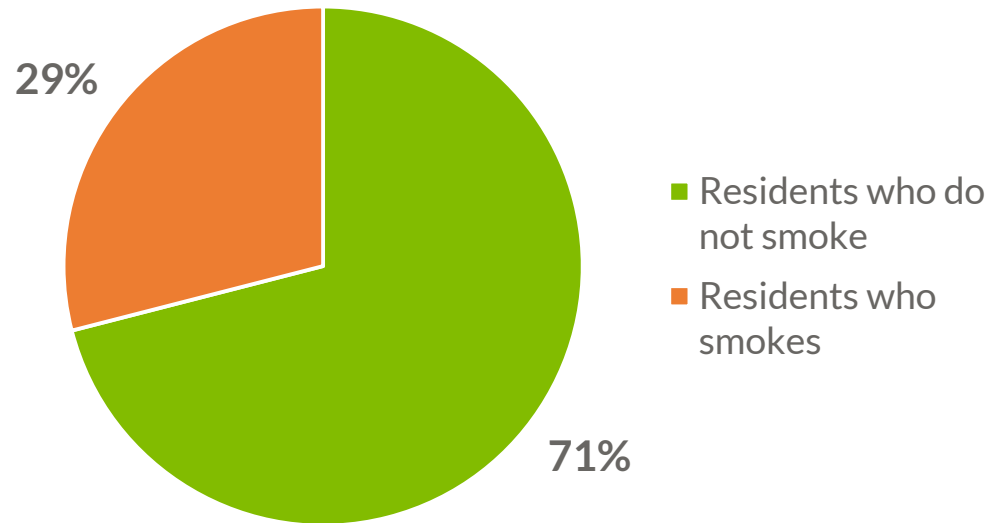

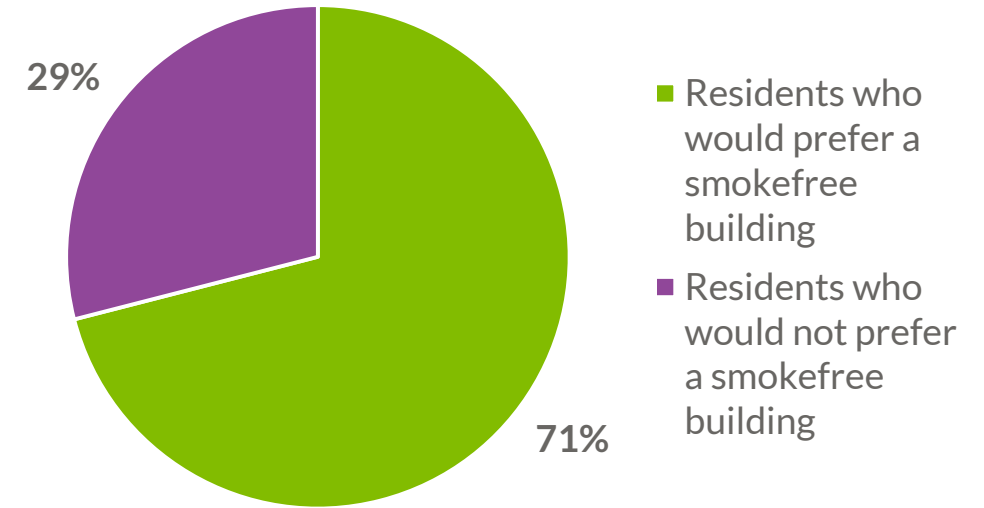


Resident Views on Smoke-Free Housing: Chicago

that is smokefree, including the units

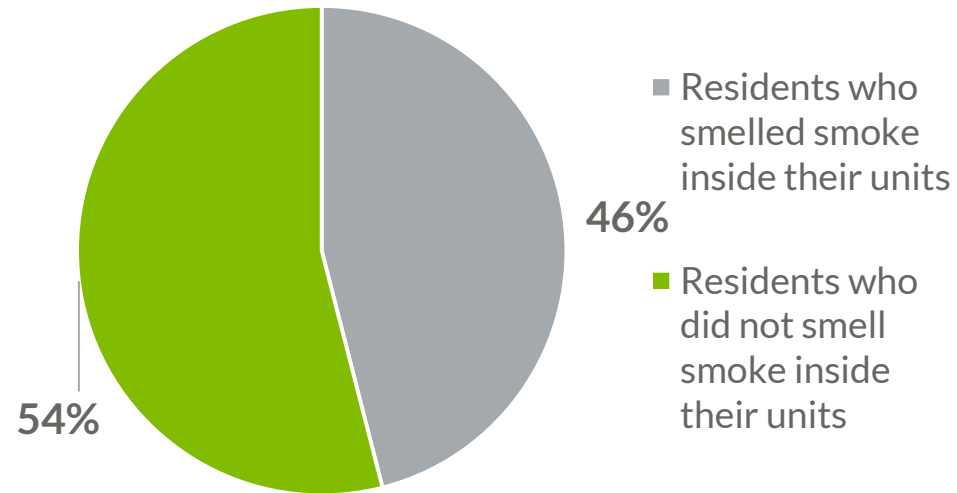

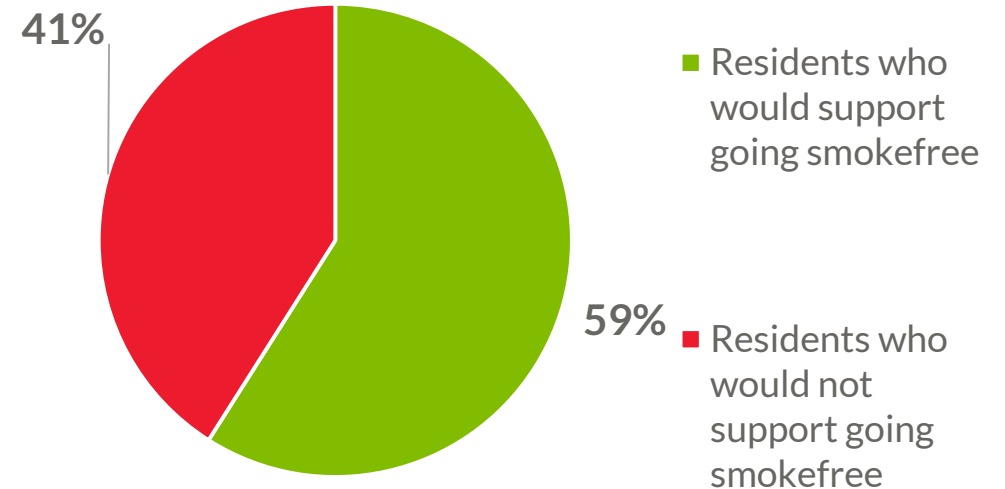
83% of residents viewed secondhand smoke as harmful to their health

Almost half of residents have smelled smoke from cigarettes or tobacco products inside their units



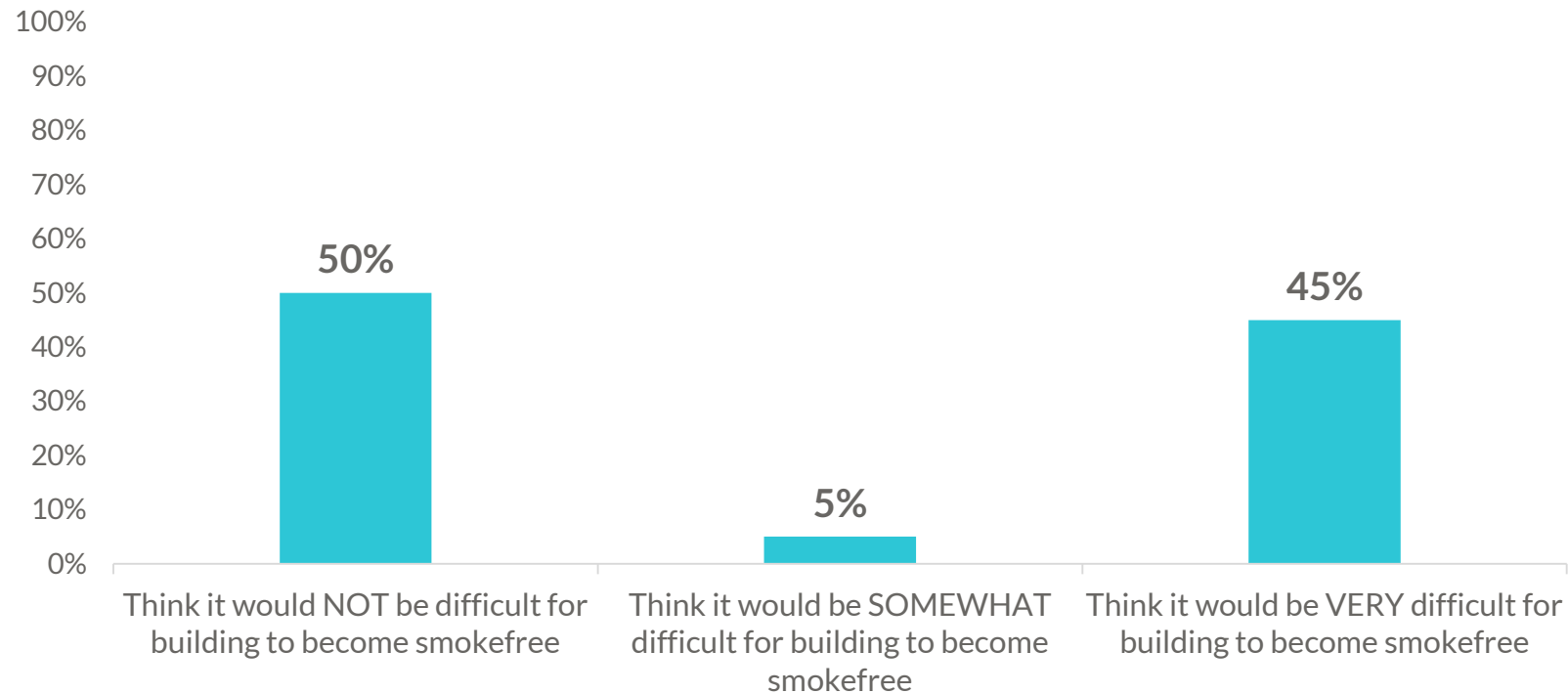
In buildings without a smokefree policy, most residents would support going smokefree

Resident Views on Smoke-Free Housing: Chicago

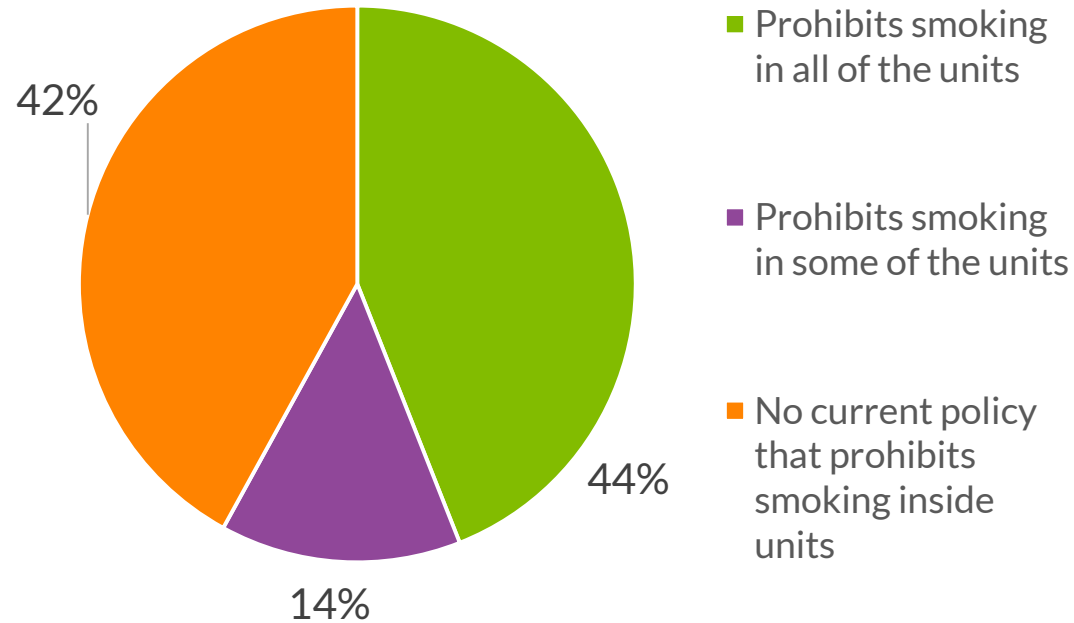
Half of residents think that it would not be difficult for them to have their building become smokefree



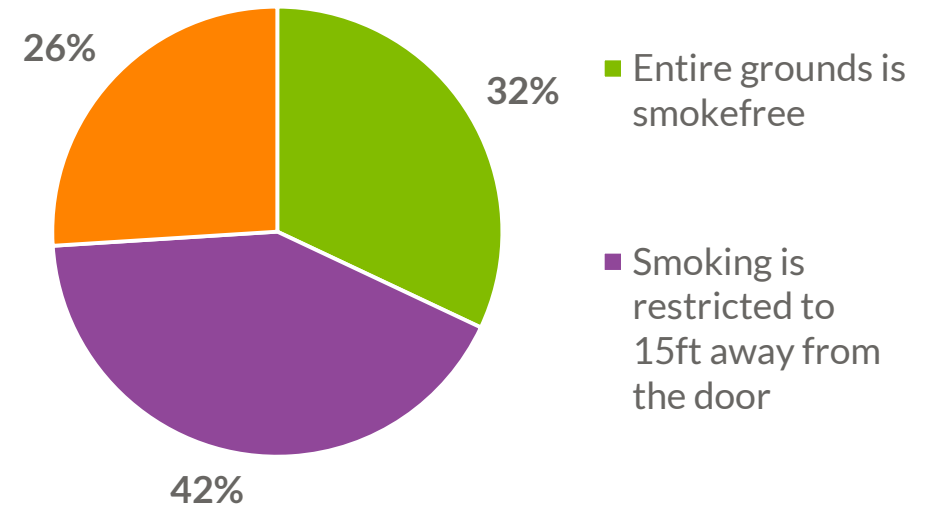

More than half of property managers prohibit smoking in all or some of their units



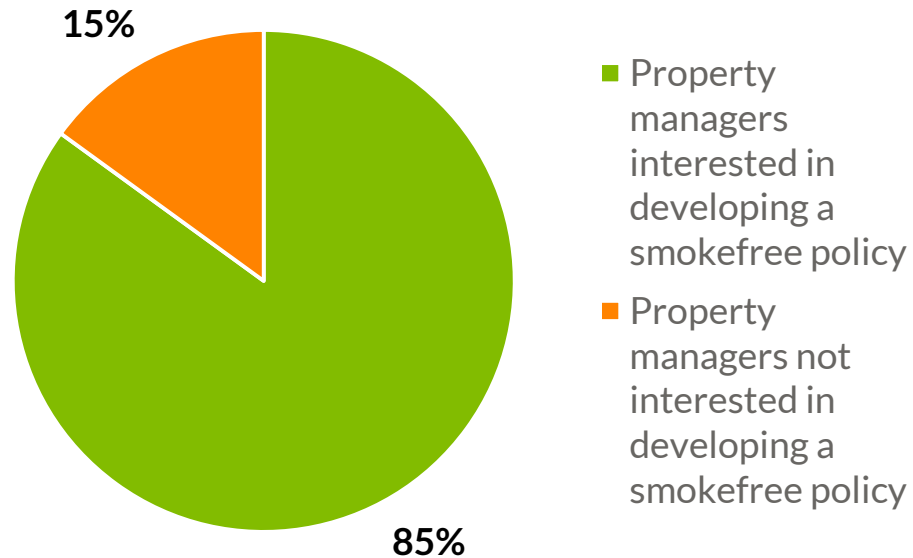
Most property managers prohibit smoking on the entire grounds or restricted to 15ft away from the door



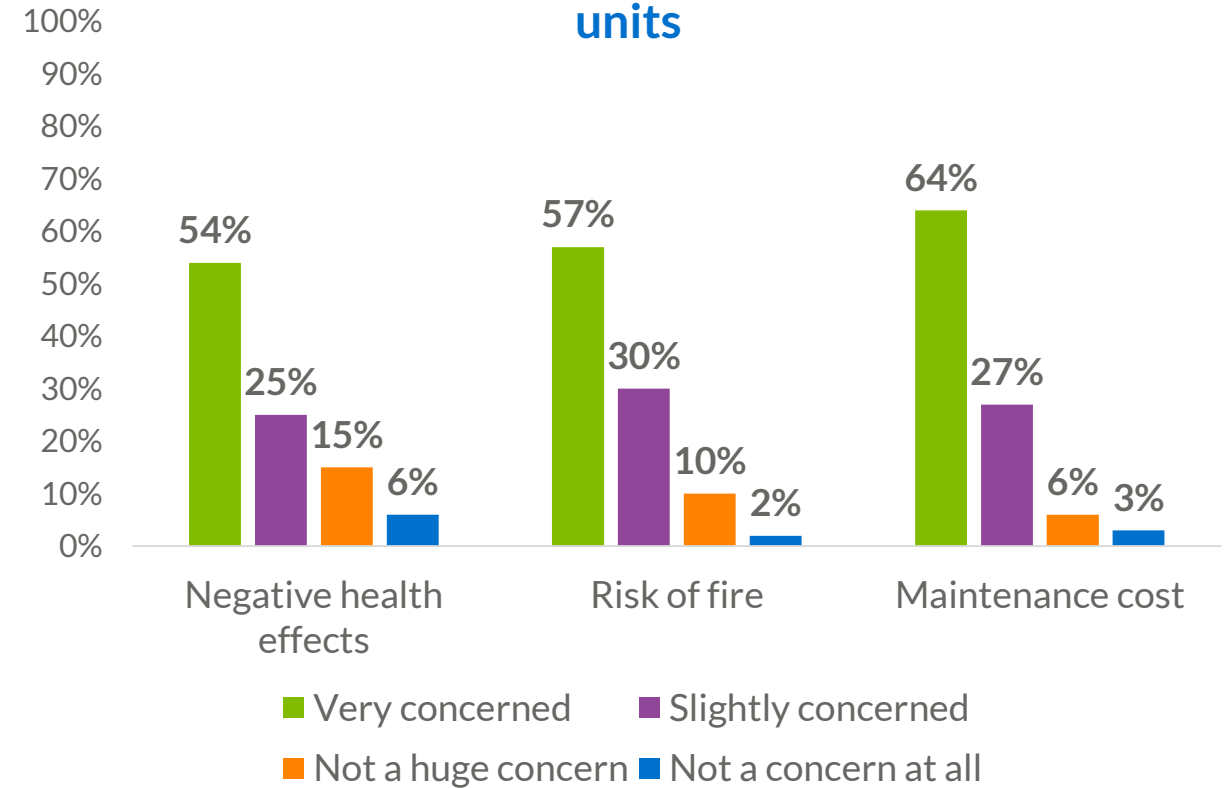

Most property managers *without* a smokefree policy are interested in developing a policy for their property



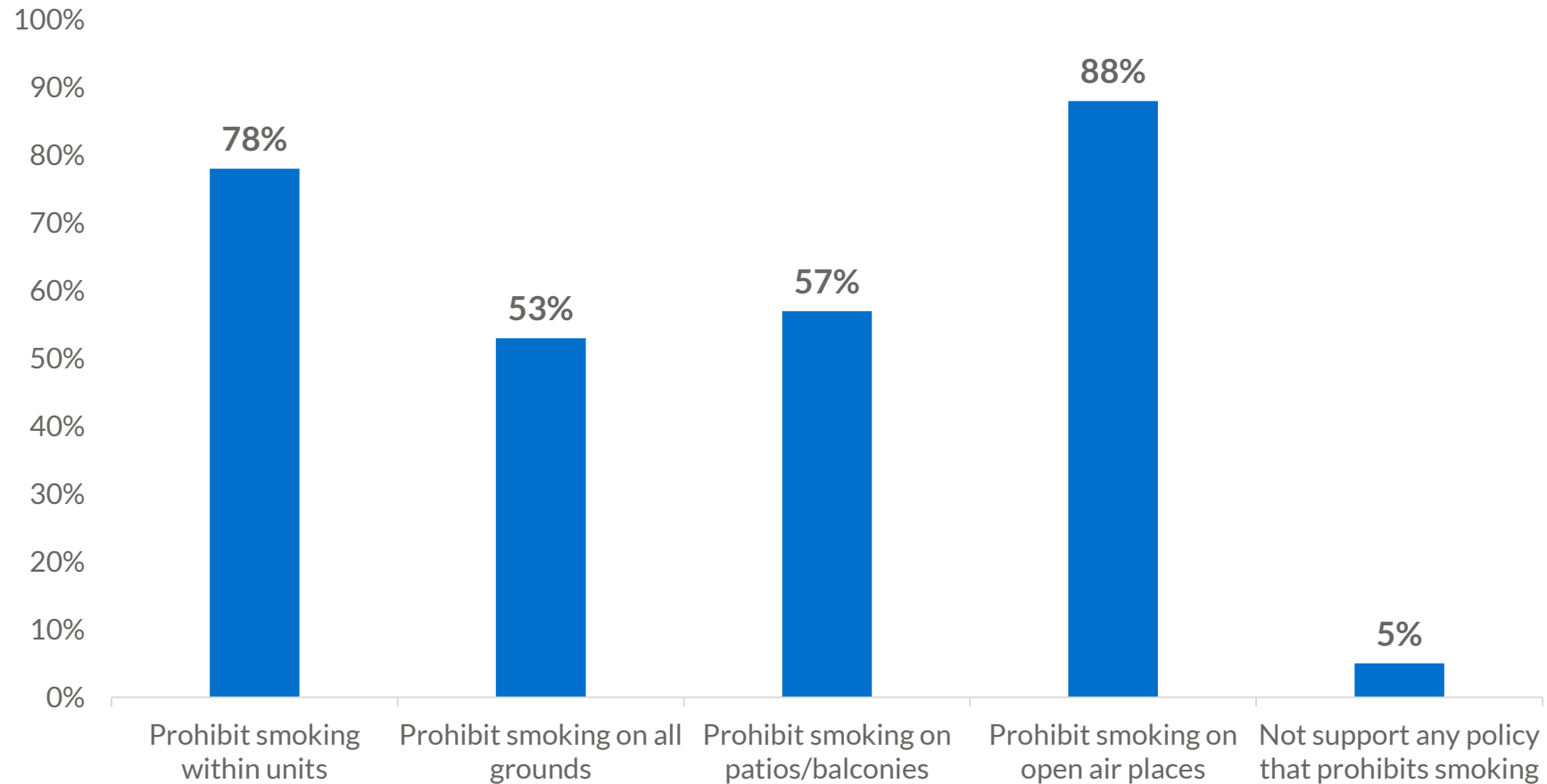
Property managers' level of concern with smoking within units

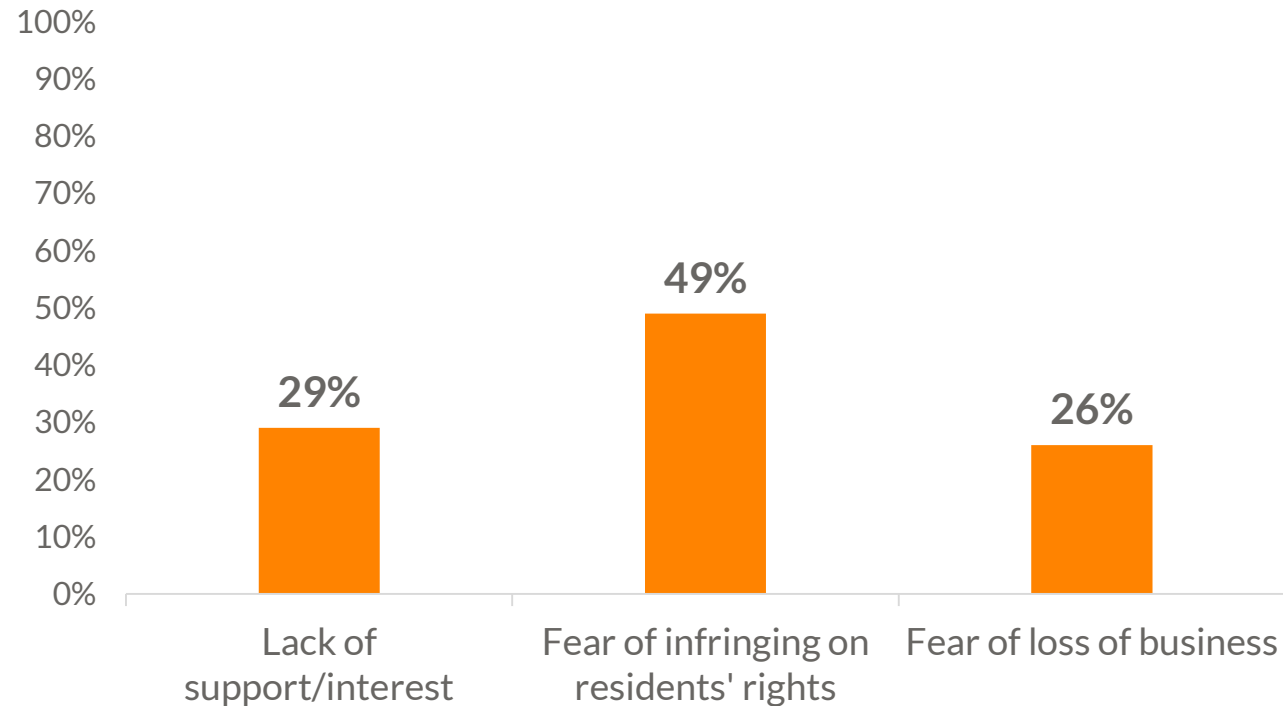
Property managers would support policies that...

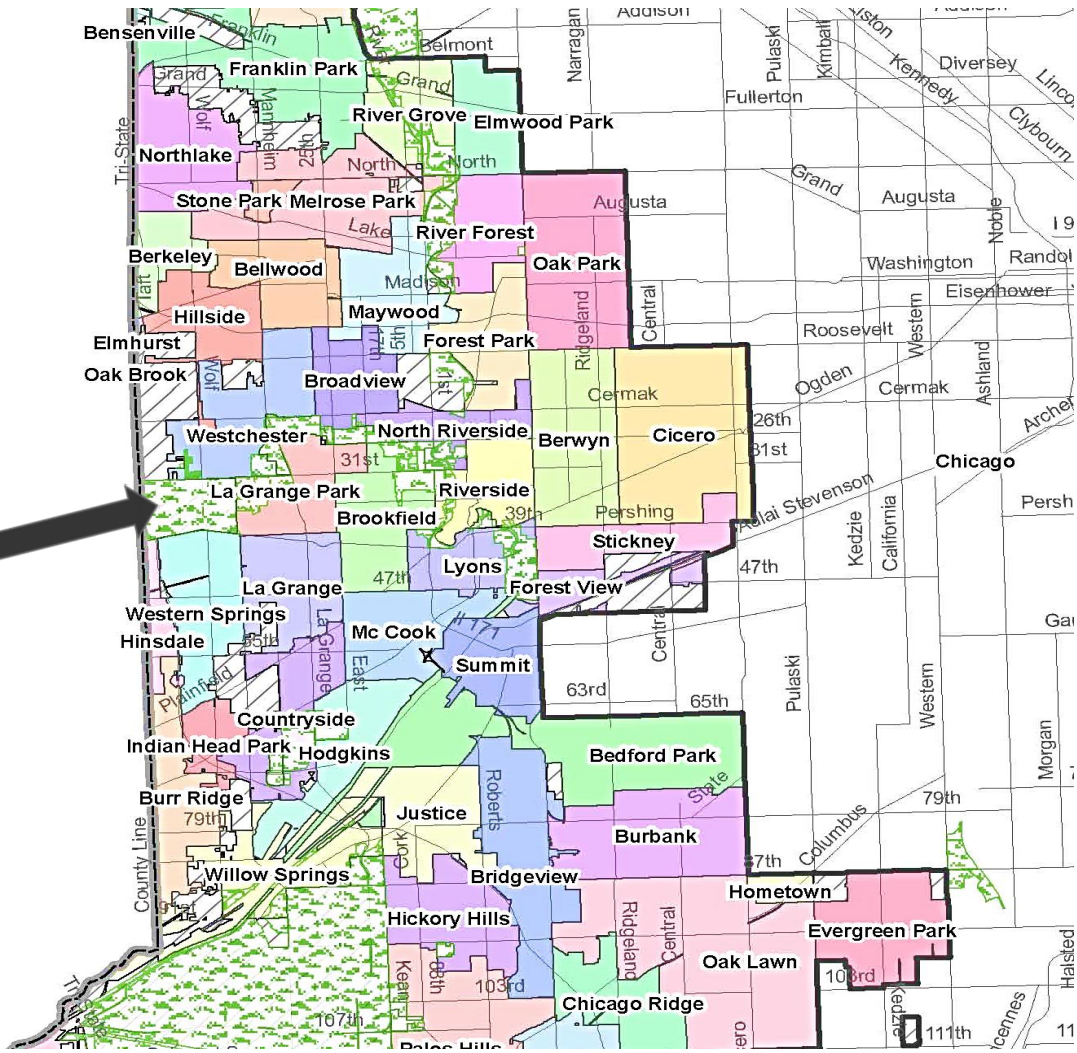
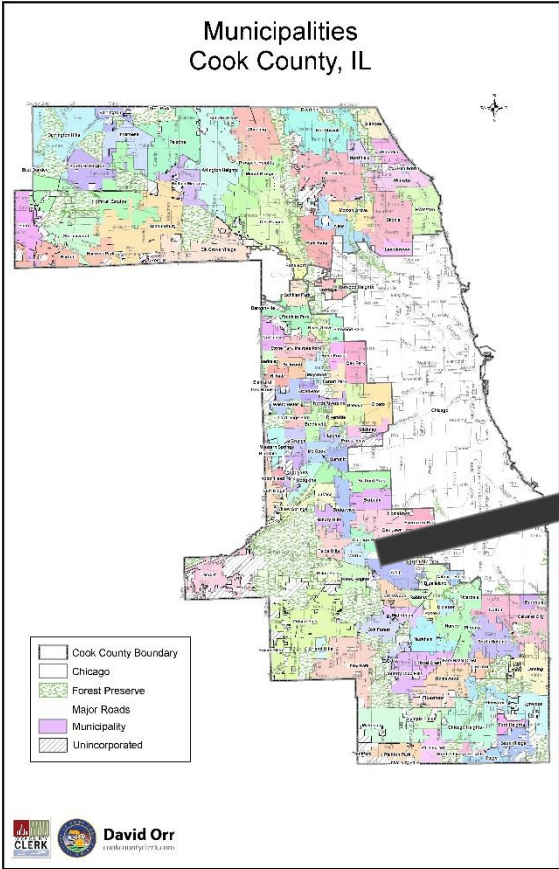

- **58** new buildings identified as smoke-free
- **13** buildings interested in going smoke-free
- Recognition as a Healthy HotSpot
